## A BILL

To amend title 49, United States Code, to provide for grants to certain urbanized areas for operating costs relating to crime prevention and security, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Safe and Affordable
- 5 Transit Act".

1	SEC. 2. OPERATING GRANTS FOR CRIME PREVENTION AND
2	SECURITY.
3	(a) Crime Prevention and Security.—Section
4	5321 of title 49, United States Code, is amended—
5	(1) by striking "The Secretary" and inserting
6	"(a) In General.—The Secretary"; and
7	(2) by adding at the end the following:
8	"(b) Operating Grants for Urbanized Areas.—
9	"(1) In General.—The Secretary may make
10	grants for operating activities for public transpor-
11	tation systems to any entity eligible to receive funds
12	under section 5307, notwithstanding the population
13	requirement under section (a)(1)(D) of such section.
14	"(2) Eligible activities.—Funds made avail-
15	able under this subsection may be used for the fol-
16	lowing:
17	"(A) Hiring additional officers to police on
18	public transportation and transit stations, in-
19	cluding the immediate vicinity of stations.
20	"(B) Contracting with local police depart-
21	ments to increase officer presence on public
22	transportation and transit stations.
23	"(C) Physical infrastructure upgrades that
24	promote public transportation passenger and
25	operator safety (including monitoring devices,

3	"(3) Authorization of appropriations.—
4	There is authorized to be appropriated \$50,000,000

7	(b) Study Required.—The Secretary of Transpor-
8	tation shall enter into an agreement with Transportation
9	Research Board of the National Academies, to conduct
10	and submit to Congress, in consultation with labor organi-
11	zations representing frontline transit workers, a study on
12	crime prevention by transit agencies that includes—
13	(1) what such agencies are doing to prevent
14	crime;
15	(2) what tactics have been successful in deter-
16	ring crime;
17	(3) what tactics have been unsuccessful in de-
18	terring crime; and
19	(4) best practices for transit agencies to reduce
20	crime within public transportation systems.
