What is the BART Police Civilian Review Board (BPCRB)?

The BPCRB is an independent oversight board of Bay Area residents whose purpose is to provide community input into the functions of the BART Police Department by:

- Holding regular public meetings with police leadership on the delivery of police services
- Advising BART's Board of Directors and Chief of Police on the policies of the police department
- Reviewing complaints by members of the public that allege police officer misconduct and recommending appropriate disciplinary action
- Participating in the selection of the Chief of Police



How Did the BPCRB Come to Be?

In 2009, a young man named Oscar Grant was shot and killed by a BART police officer at Oakland's Fruitvale Station. That incident led to protests and calls for systemic reform and accountability.

In response, BART created the BPCRB and the Office of the Independent Police Auditor (OIPA). The BPCRB serves as the community advisory board on police affairs, and the OIPA is the agency that conducts complaint investigations and audits of the police department.

The BPCRB and OIPA continue to work diligently with the BART Police Department to ensure its officers receive the proper training and support to respond appropriately and to fulfill its mission to ensure a safe environment for all BART riders.

The BPCRB meets every second Monday of each month at 4:00 p.m. in the BART Board Room, located at 2150 Webster Street, 1st Floor, Oakland, CA 94612. These meetings are open for the public to attend in person, or online on Zoom at:
