Thanks for you note and thanks for riding your bike to BART!

We have 60 BikeLink lockers at Rockridge and it's possible, but I'm doubtful that all of them were in use or out of service any time recently. It could be that there are lockers in locations you are not aware of.

Attached is my map of bike parking at Rockridge. As you will see, we have lockers in three places:

Dear Ellen,

Thanks for your note and thanks for riding your bike to BART.

We are aware that the strap length makes is challenging to reach a second and third bike stored in the bike priority area. Unfortunately, however, we can't make the straps longer because there's an air intake near the floor that our car engineers advise would be at risk of blockage if we used longer straps. This is a longstanding issue and probably my number one customer service complaint from the public. I spent a fair bit of time brainstorming solutions with my colleagues, but I'm afraid there's nothing more we can do. If you regularly find yourself unable to strap a bike due to the length, I'd suggest bringing your own bungee or strap with a buckle. A project I have been trying to make time for is to order some longer straps that I can just give away to anyone who needs one.
