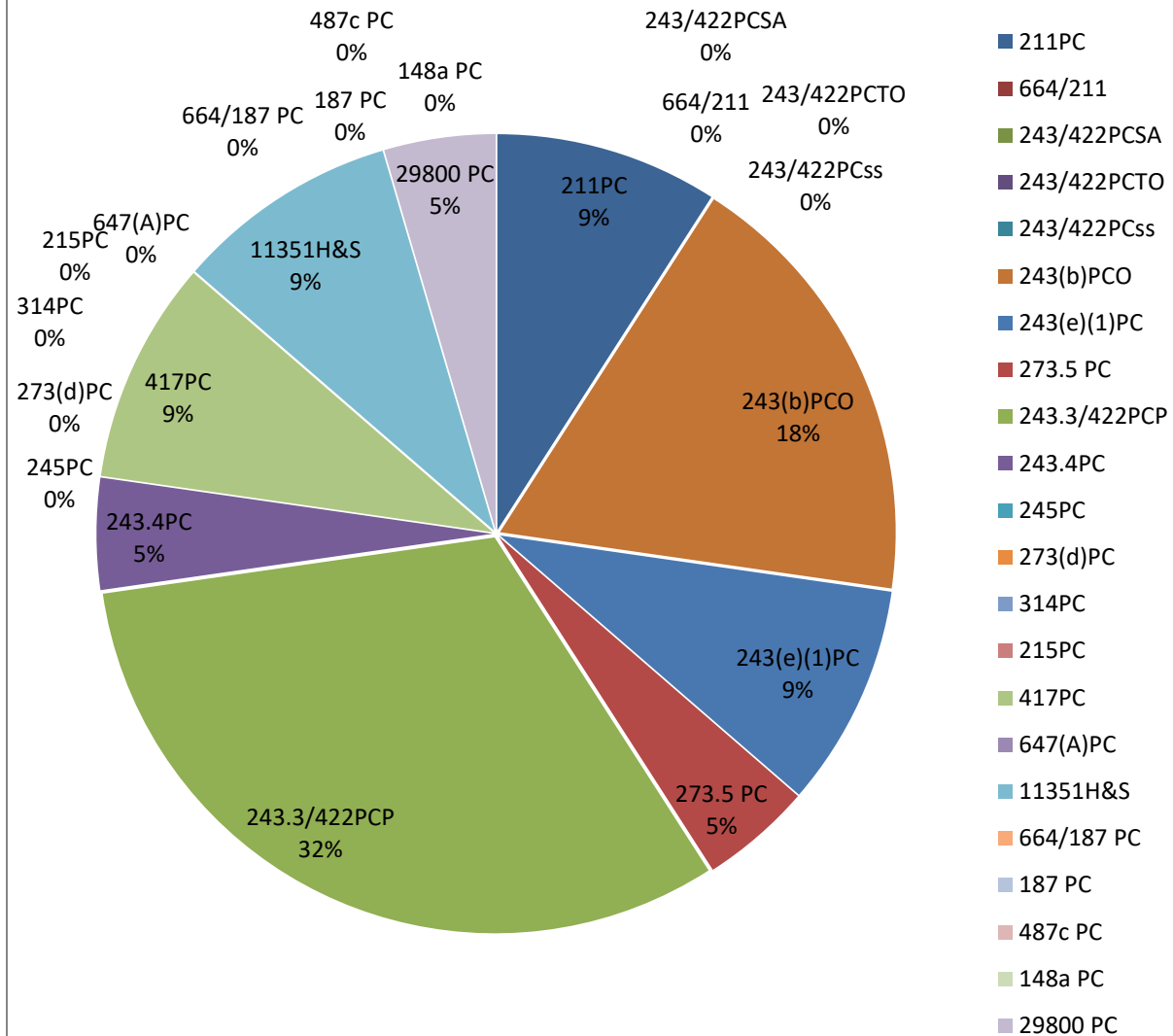

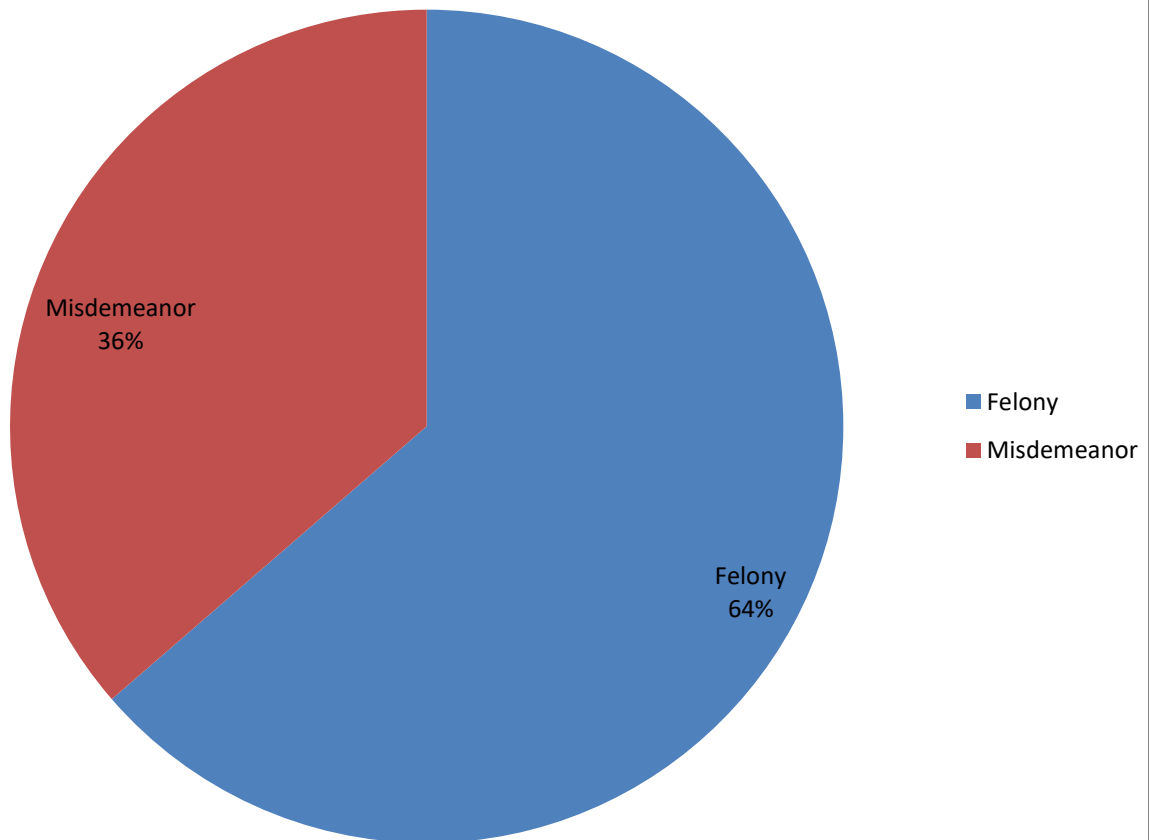

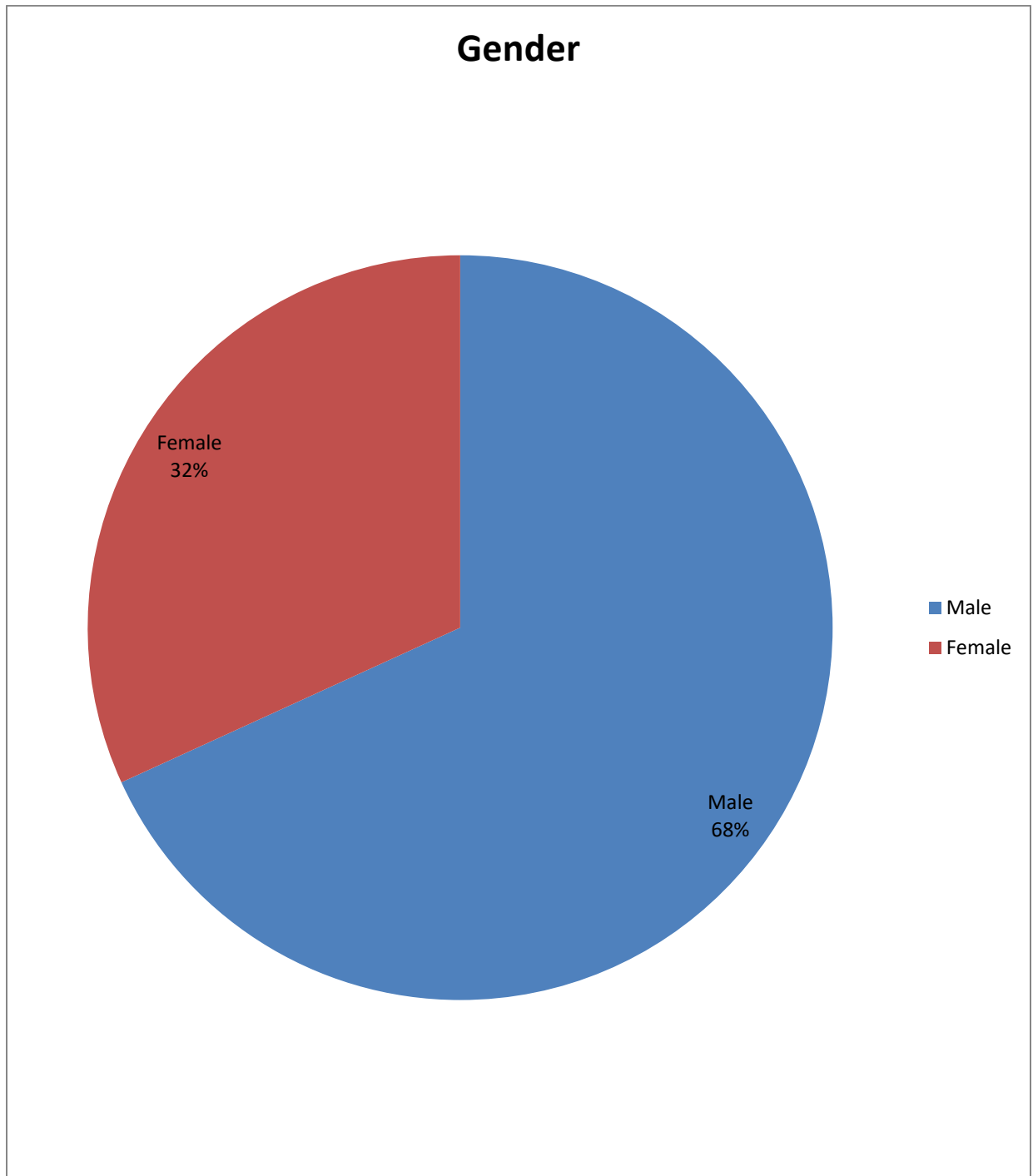

Crime Classification

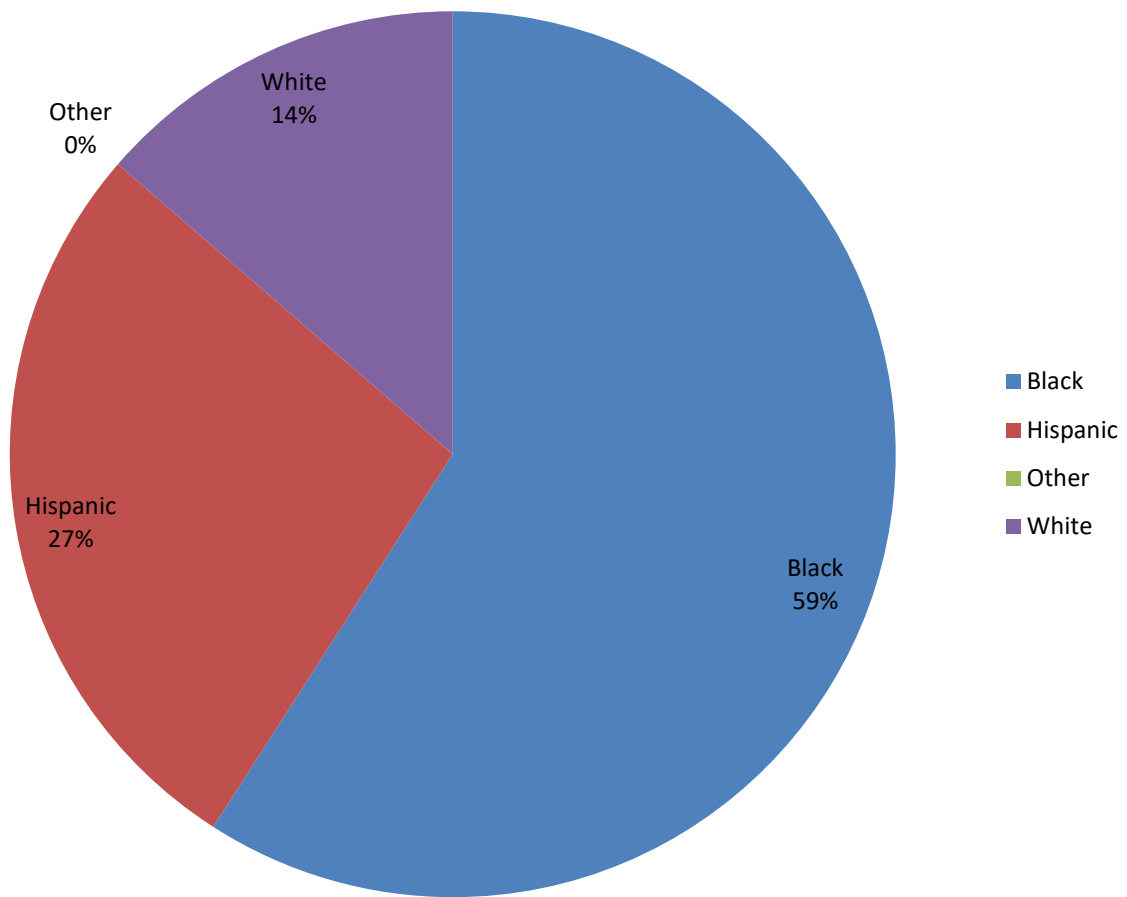

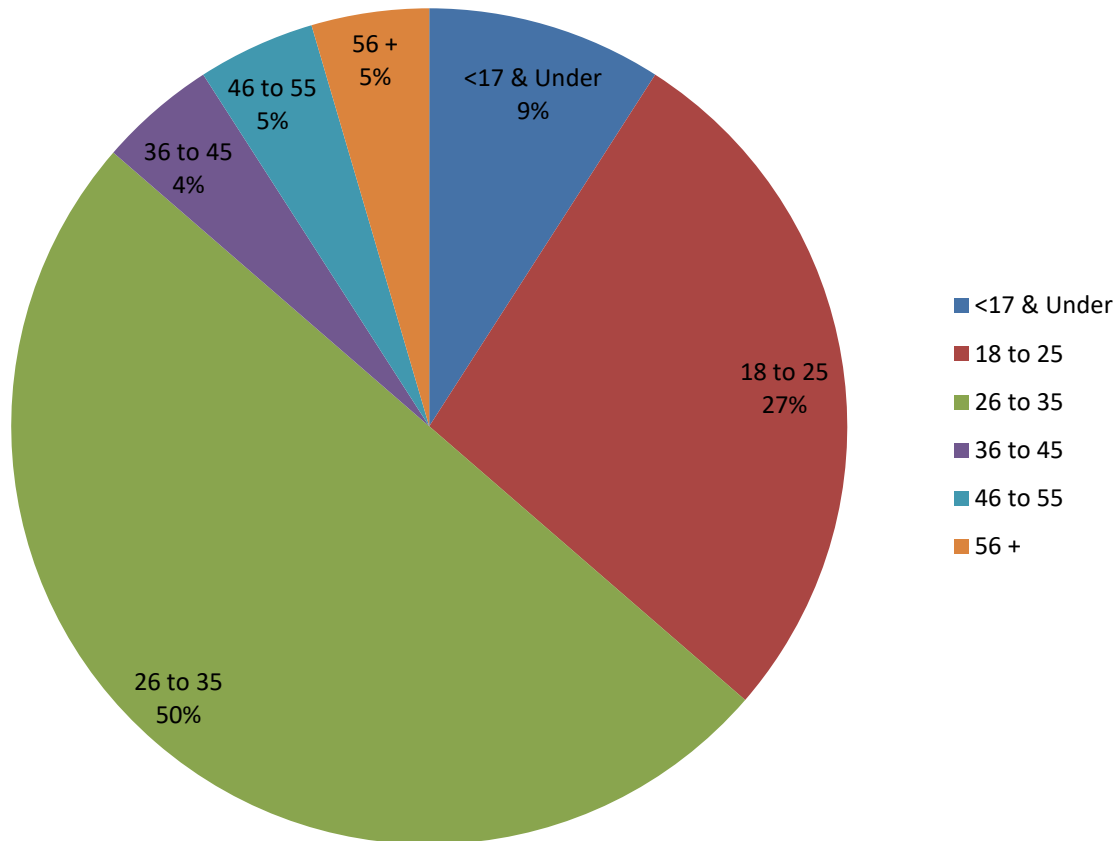
AB730 Violation Statistics August (2022)

Ethnic Background

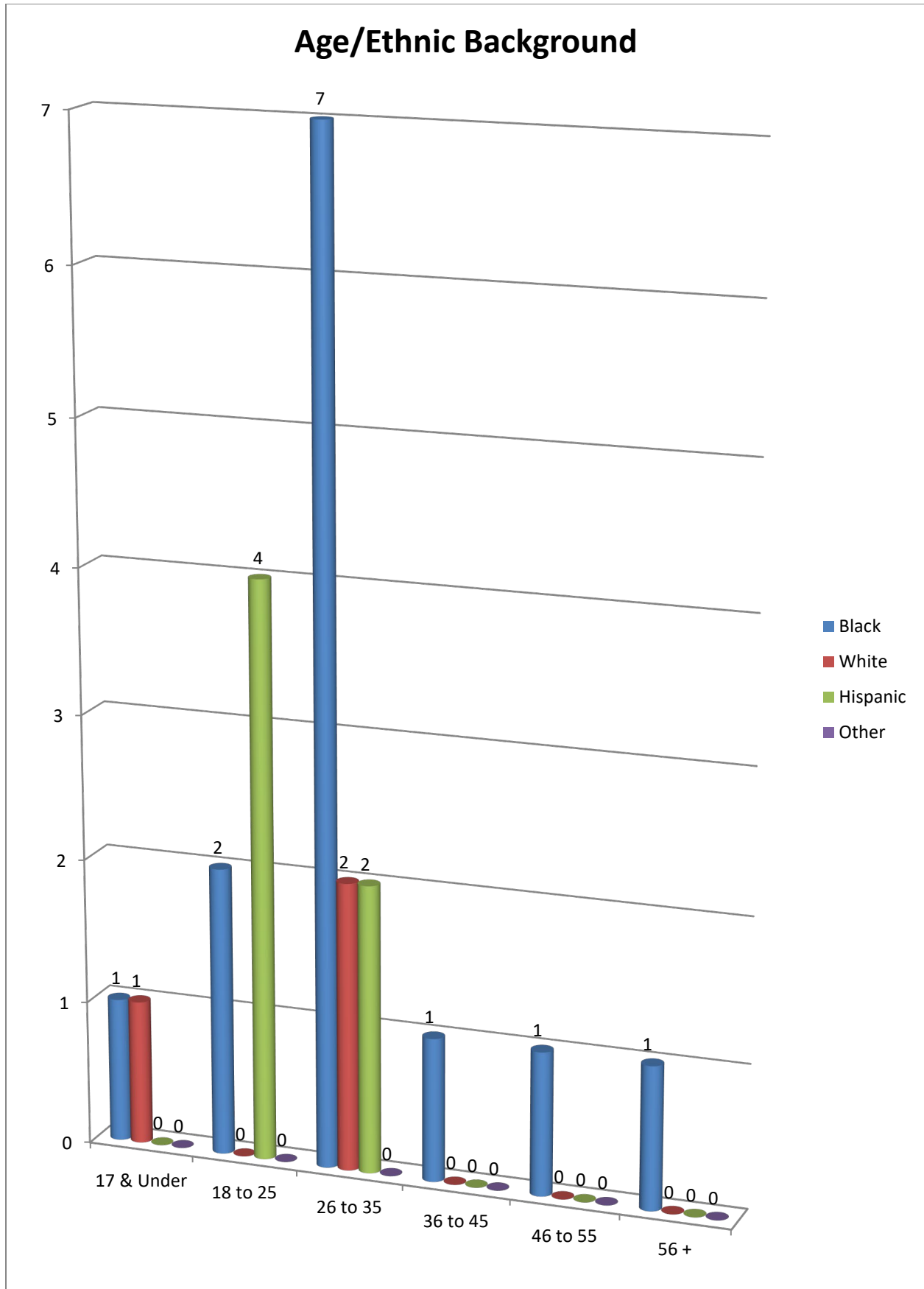

Age

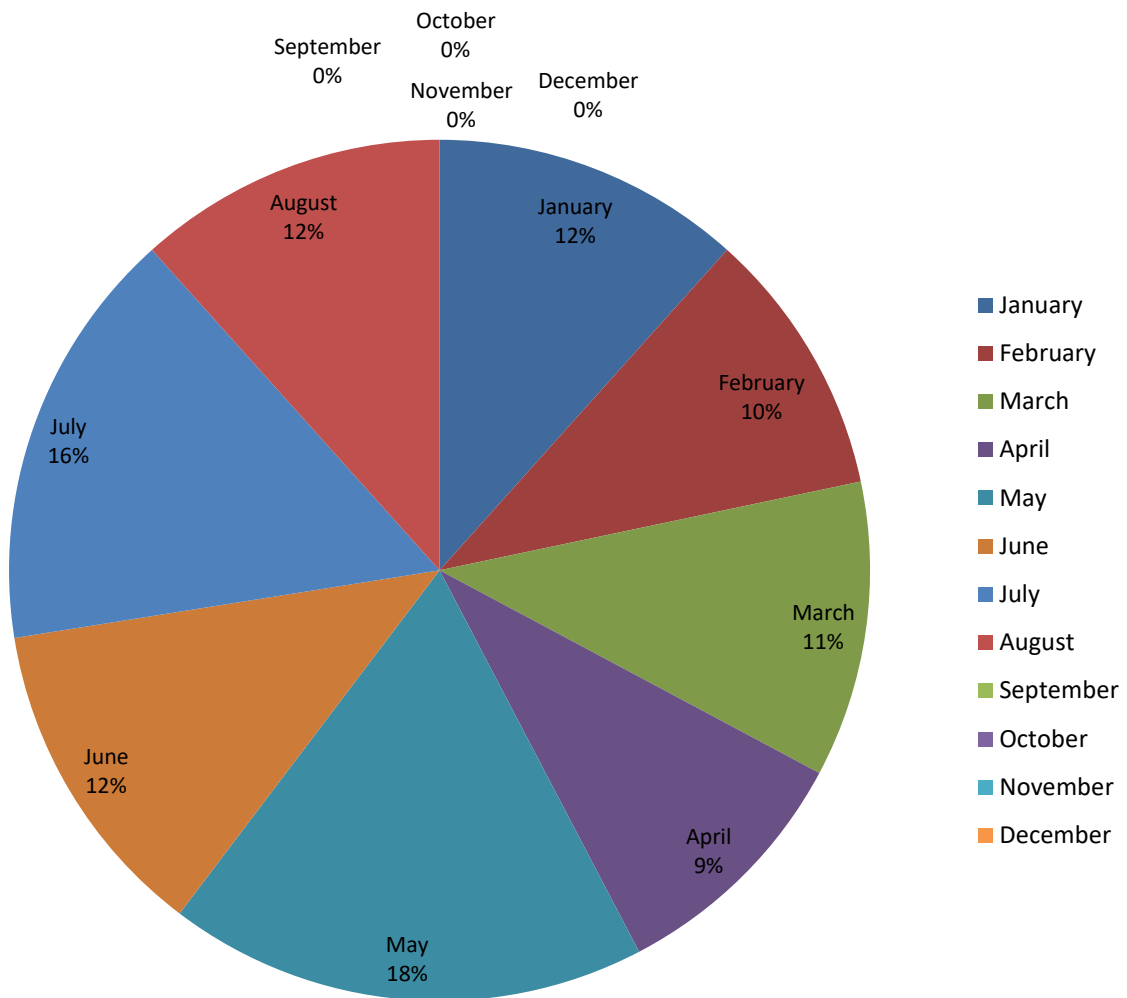

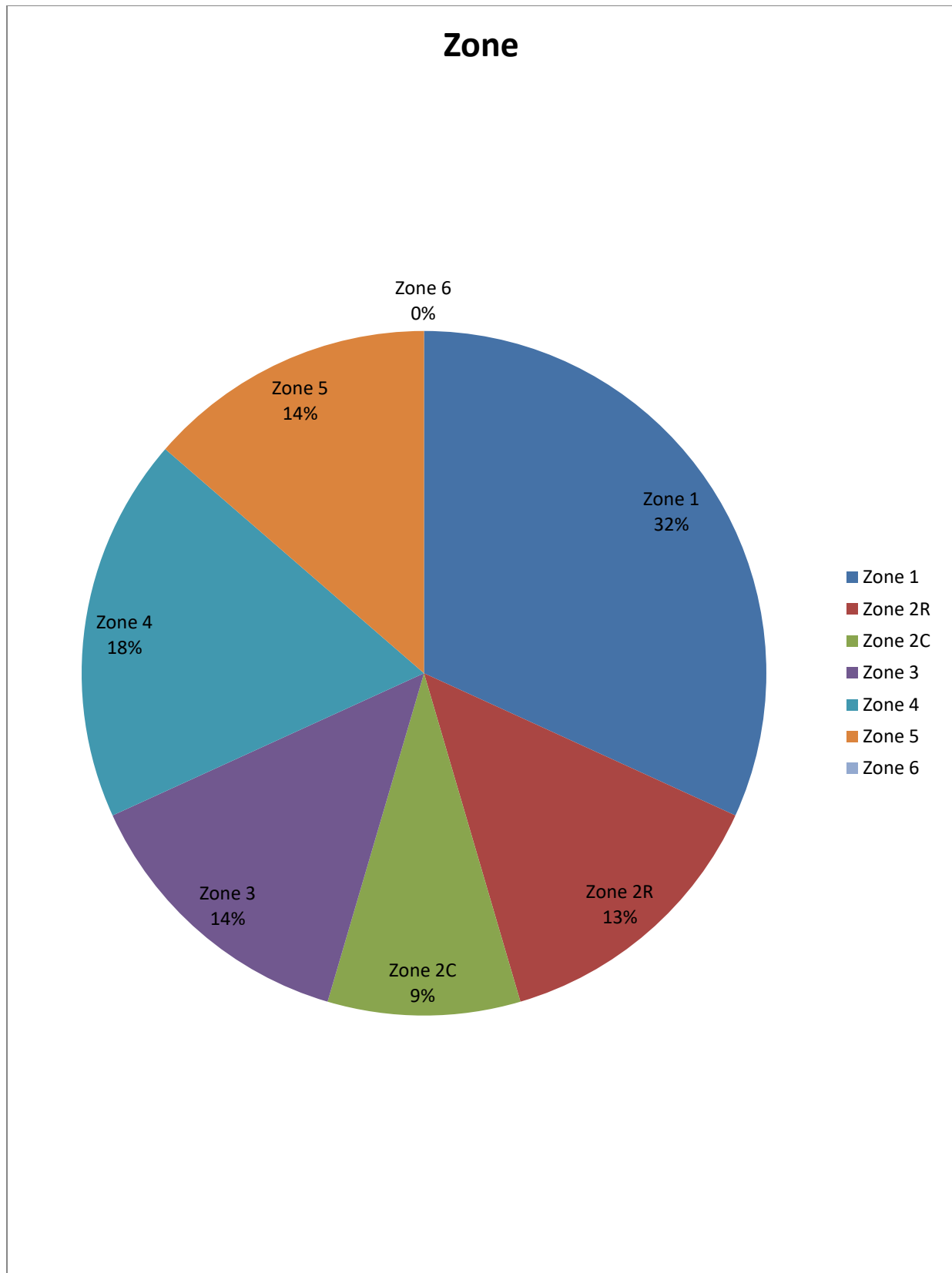


AB730 Violation Statistics August (2022)
