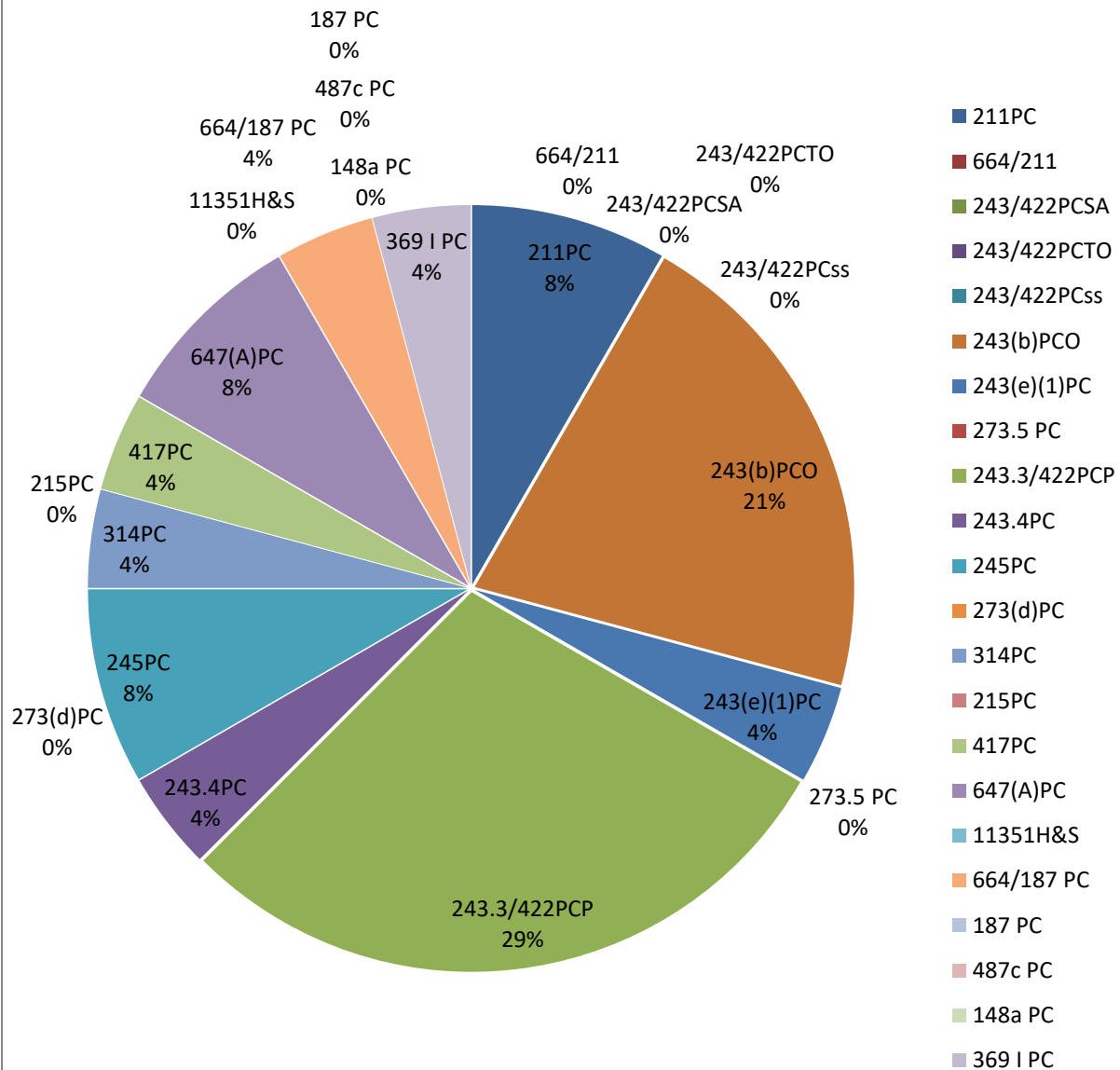

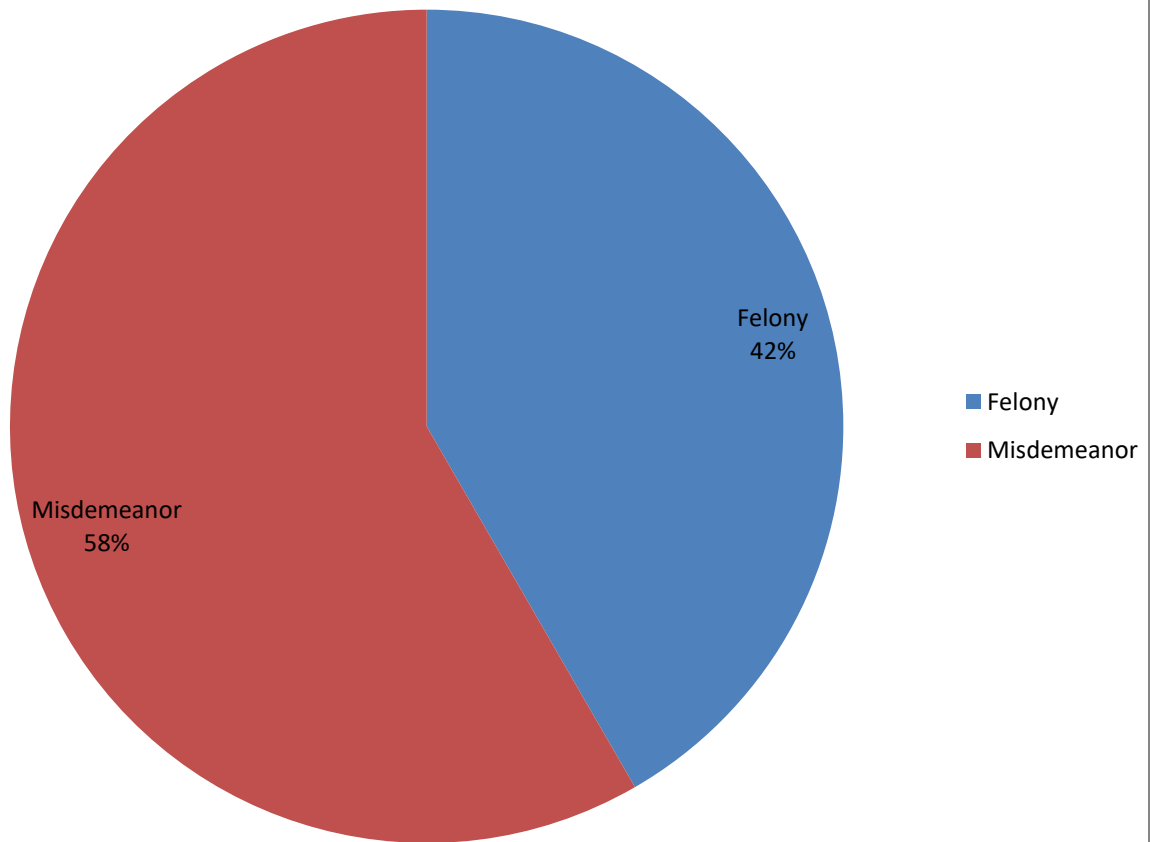

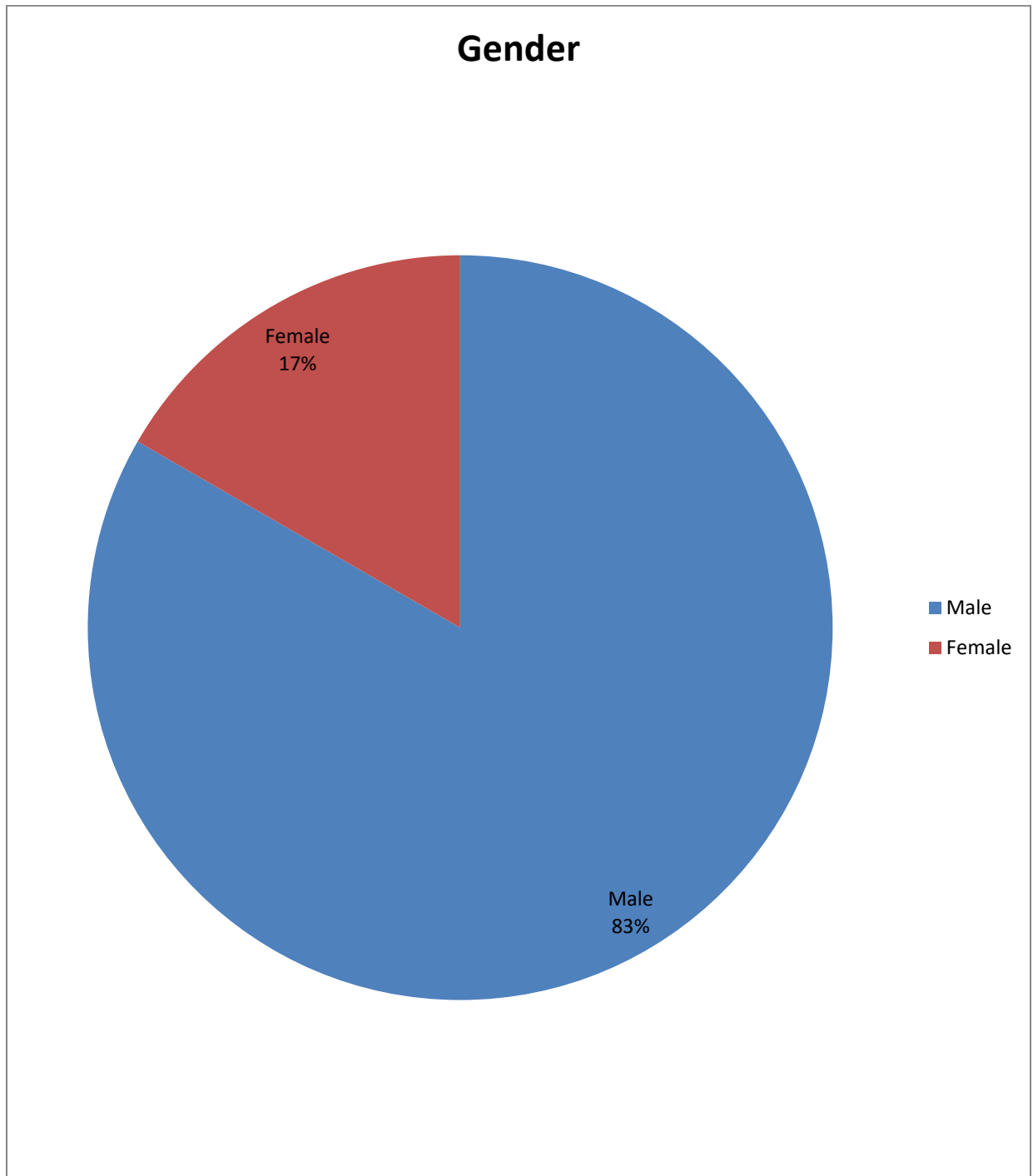

Crime Classification

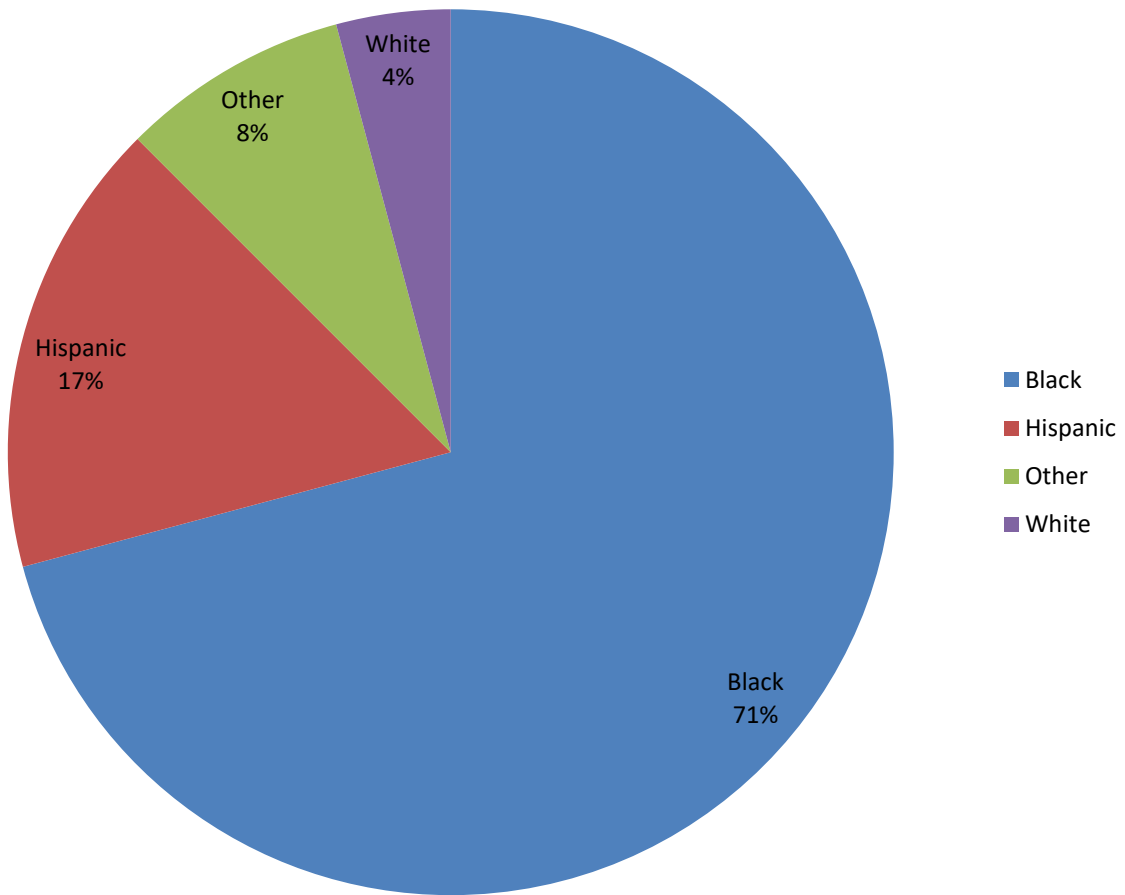

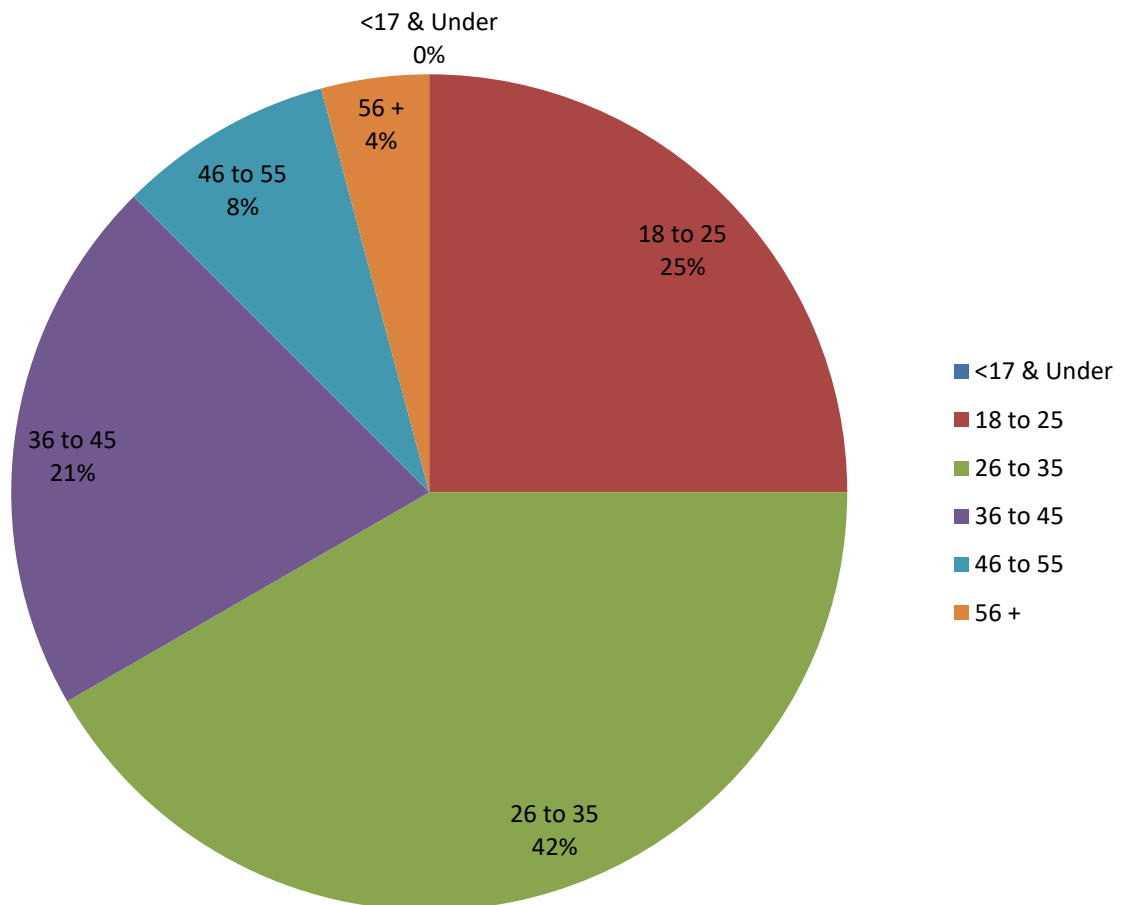
AB730 Violation Statistics April (2023)

Ethnic Background

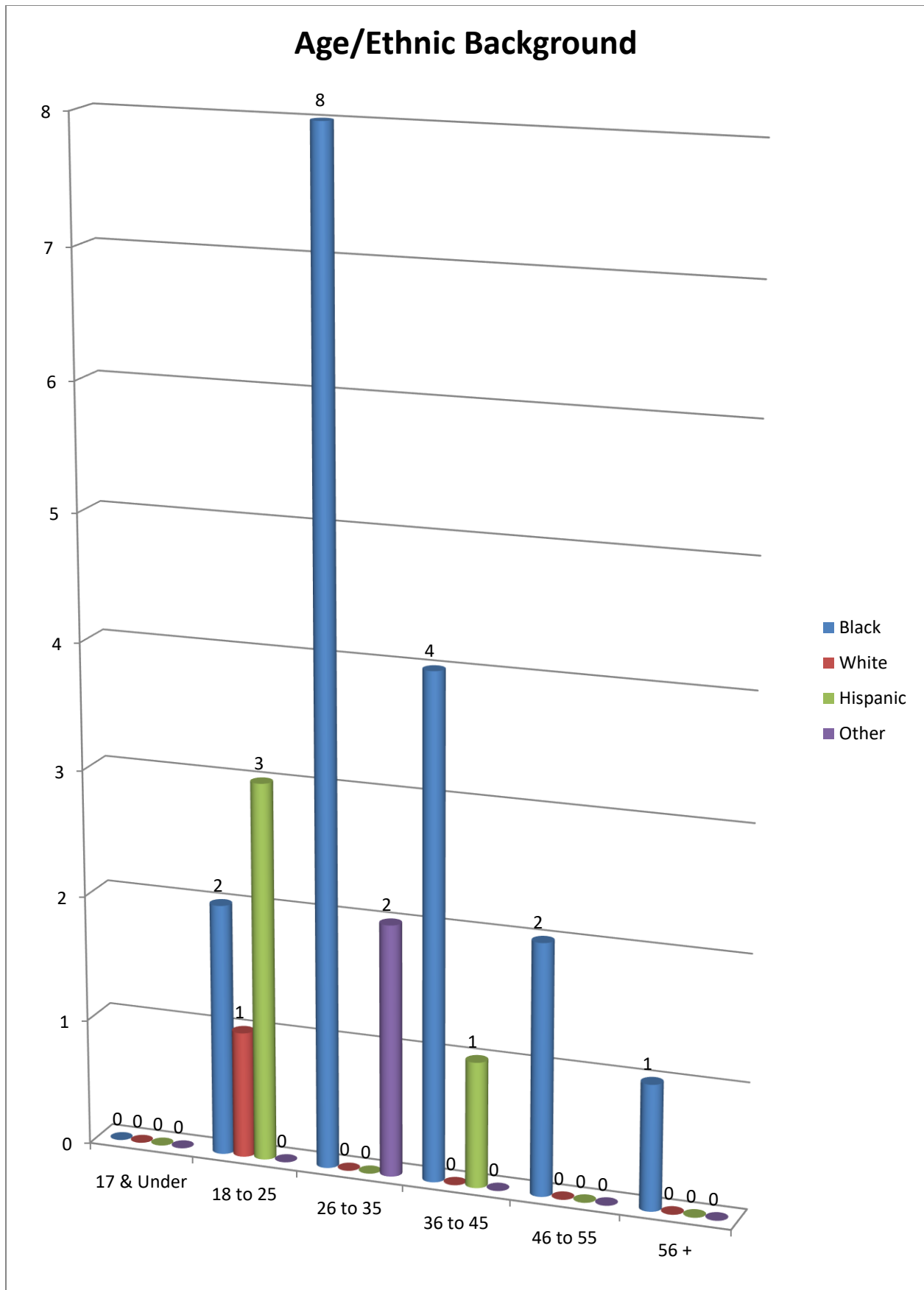

Age

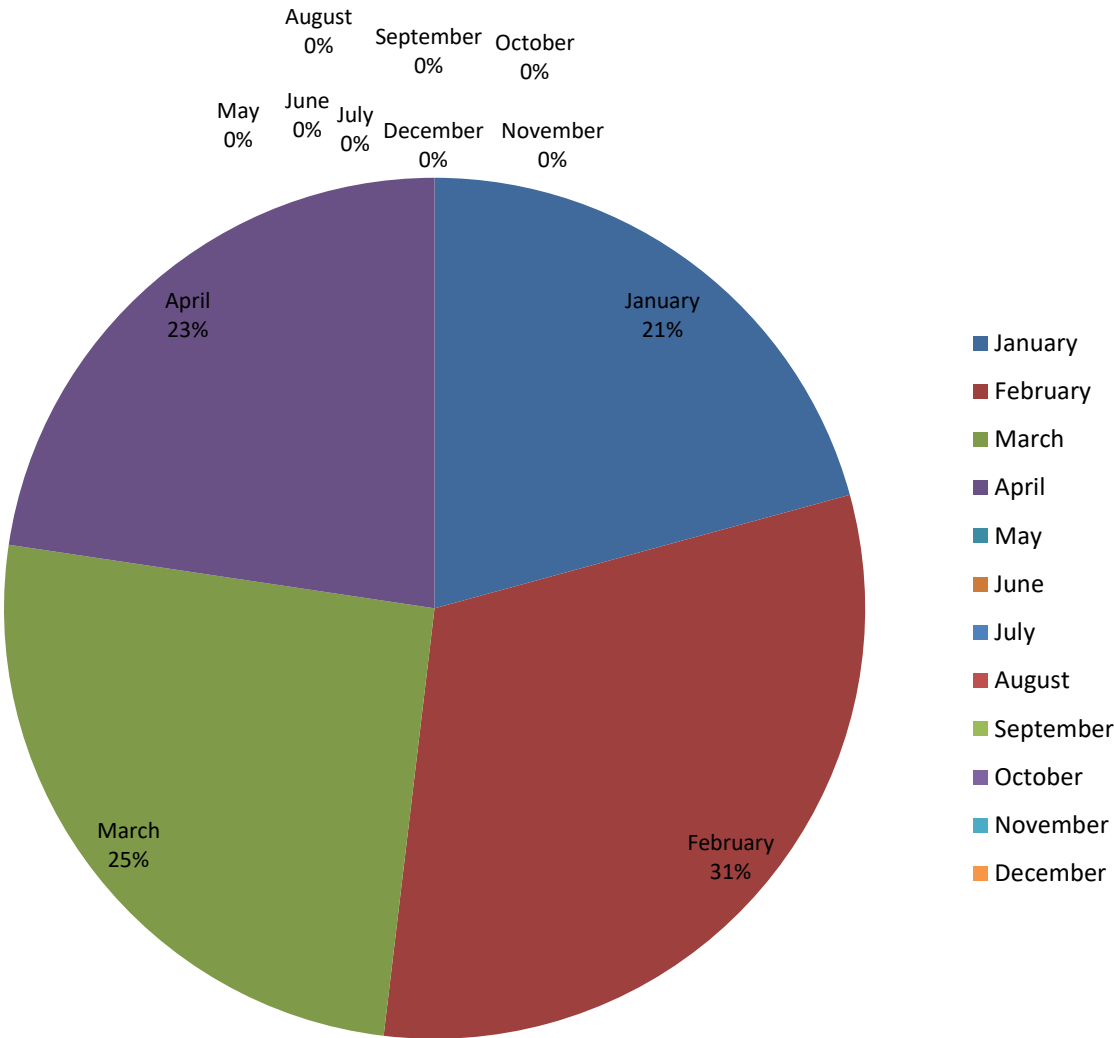

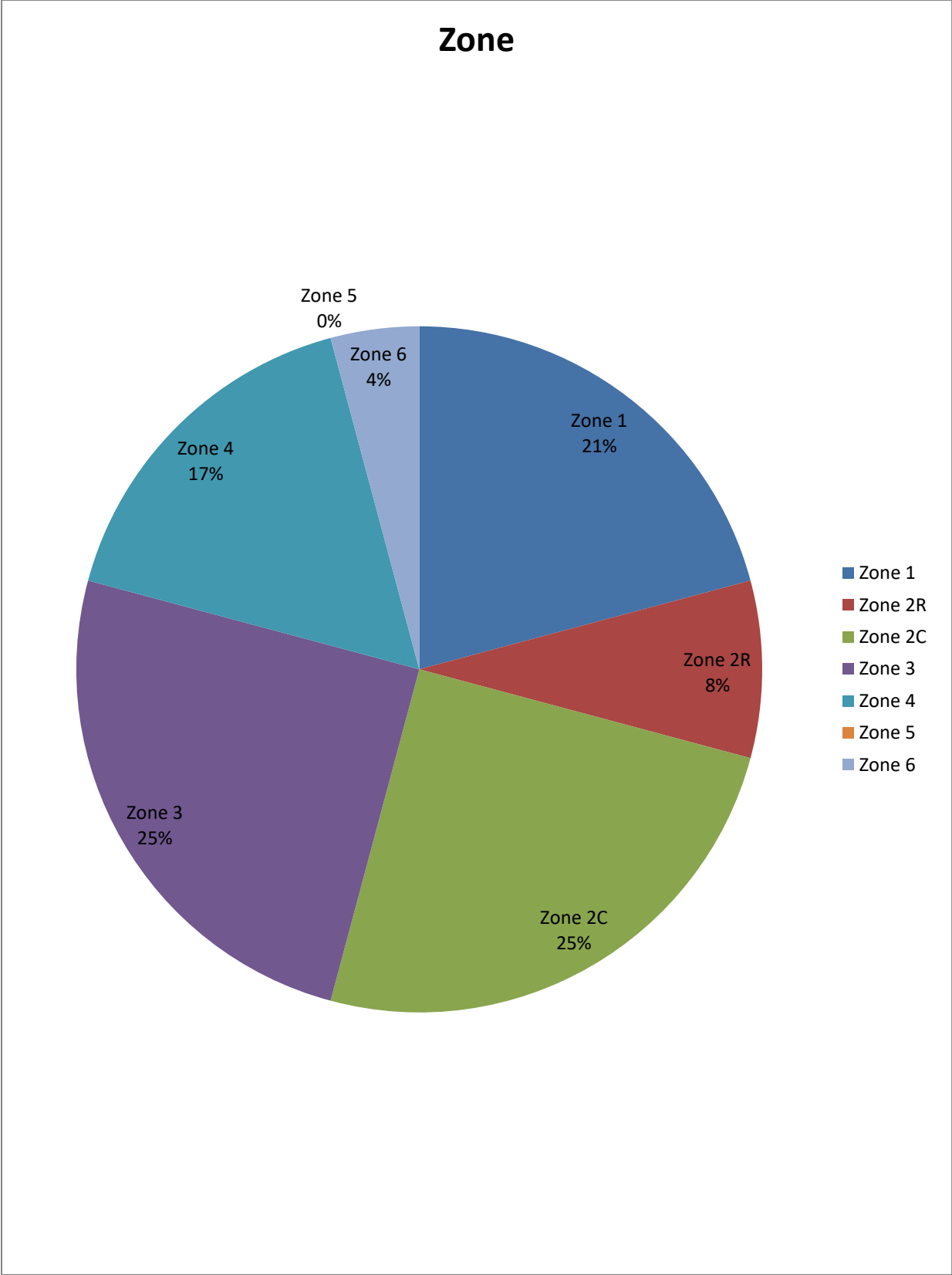


AB730 Violation Statistics April (2023)
