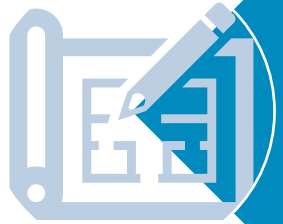

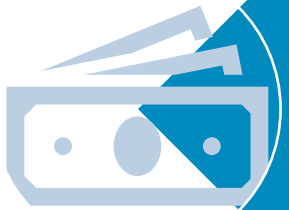

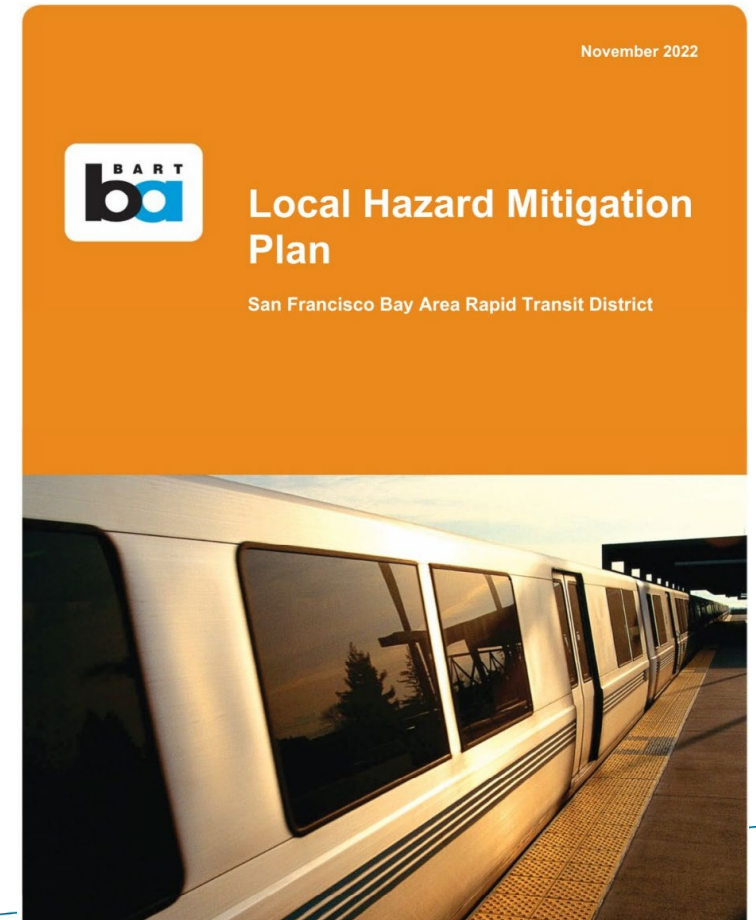
Purpose of the Local Hazard Mitigation Plan



The Federal Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 requires local governments to develop a Local Hazard Mitigation Plan



An approved plan makes BART eligible for mitigation grant assistance



Local Hazard Mitigation Plan Goal

Maintain and enhance a disaster-resistance District by reducing the potential for loss of life, property damage, and environmental degradation from natural disasters, while supporting economic recovery from such disasters.

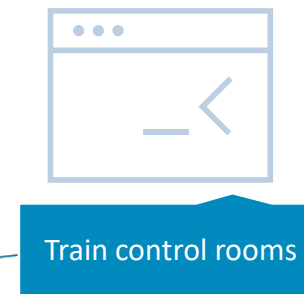
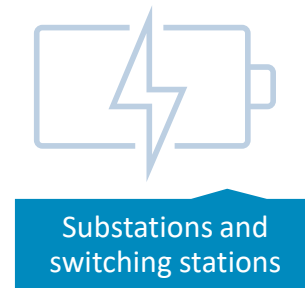

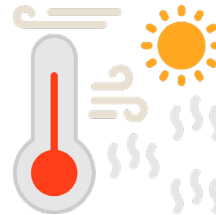

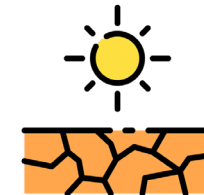

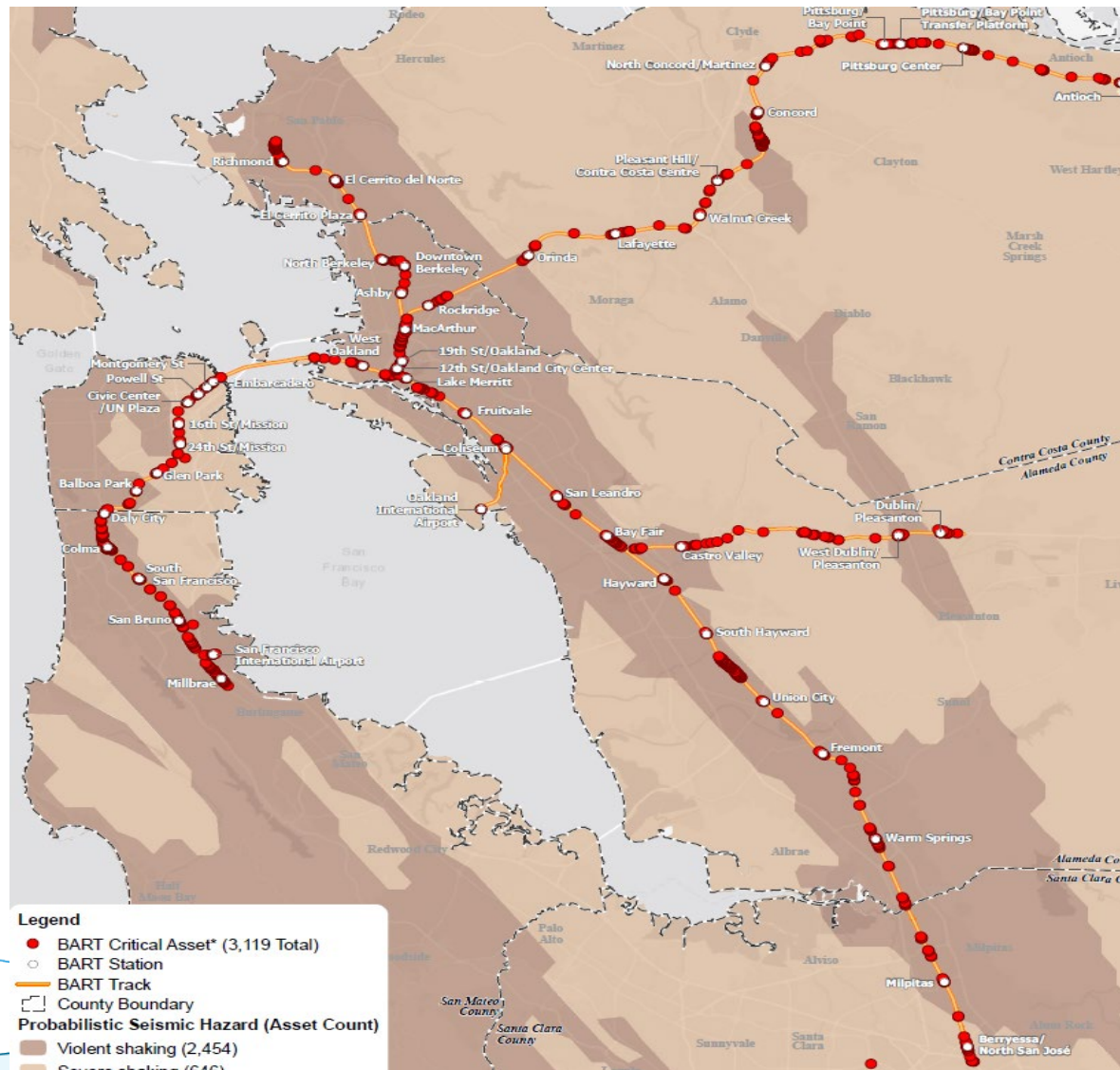


Sea Level Rise

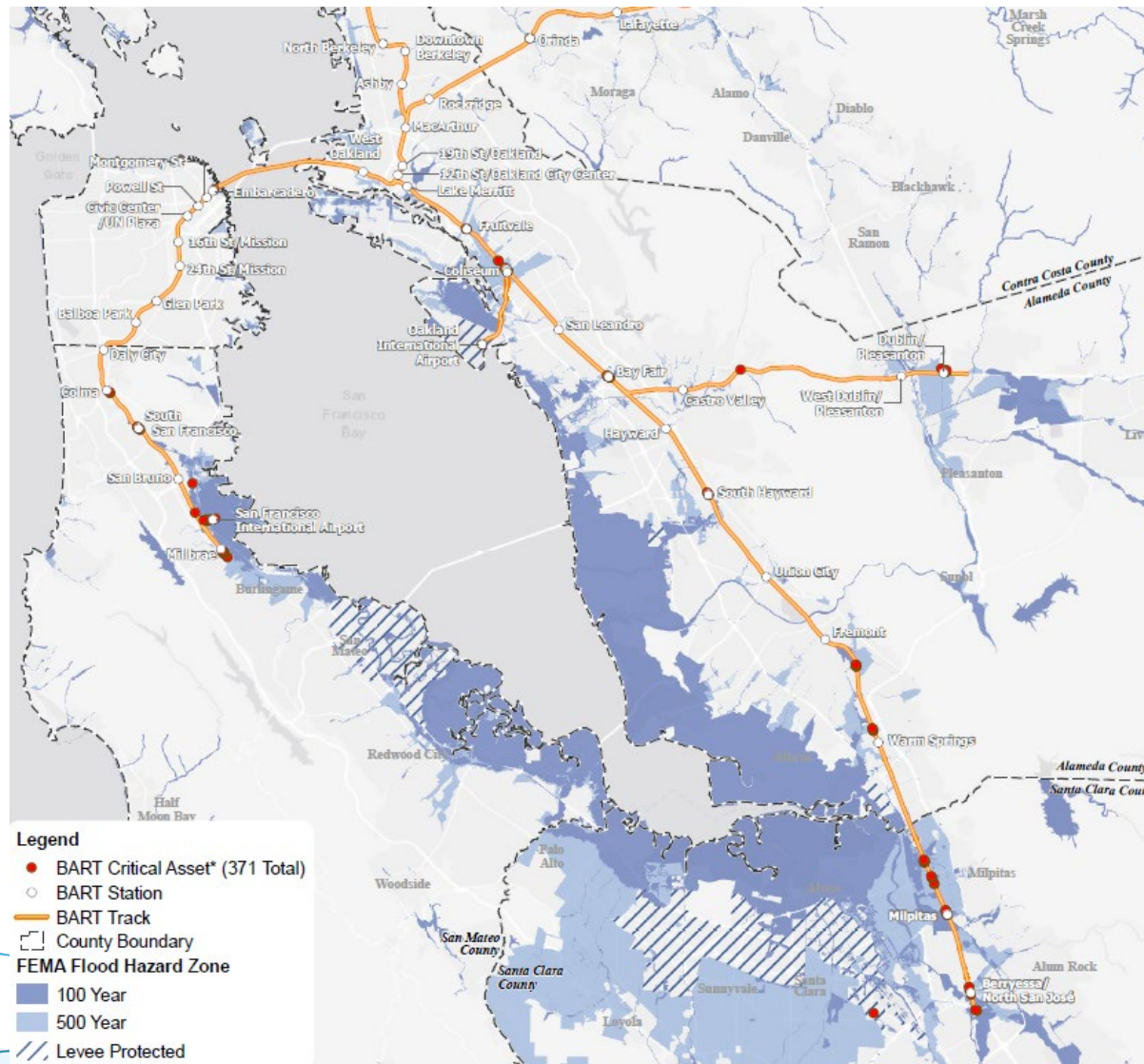

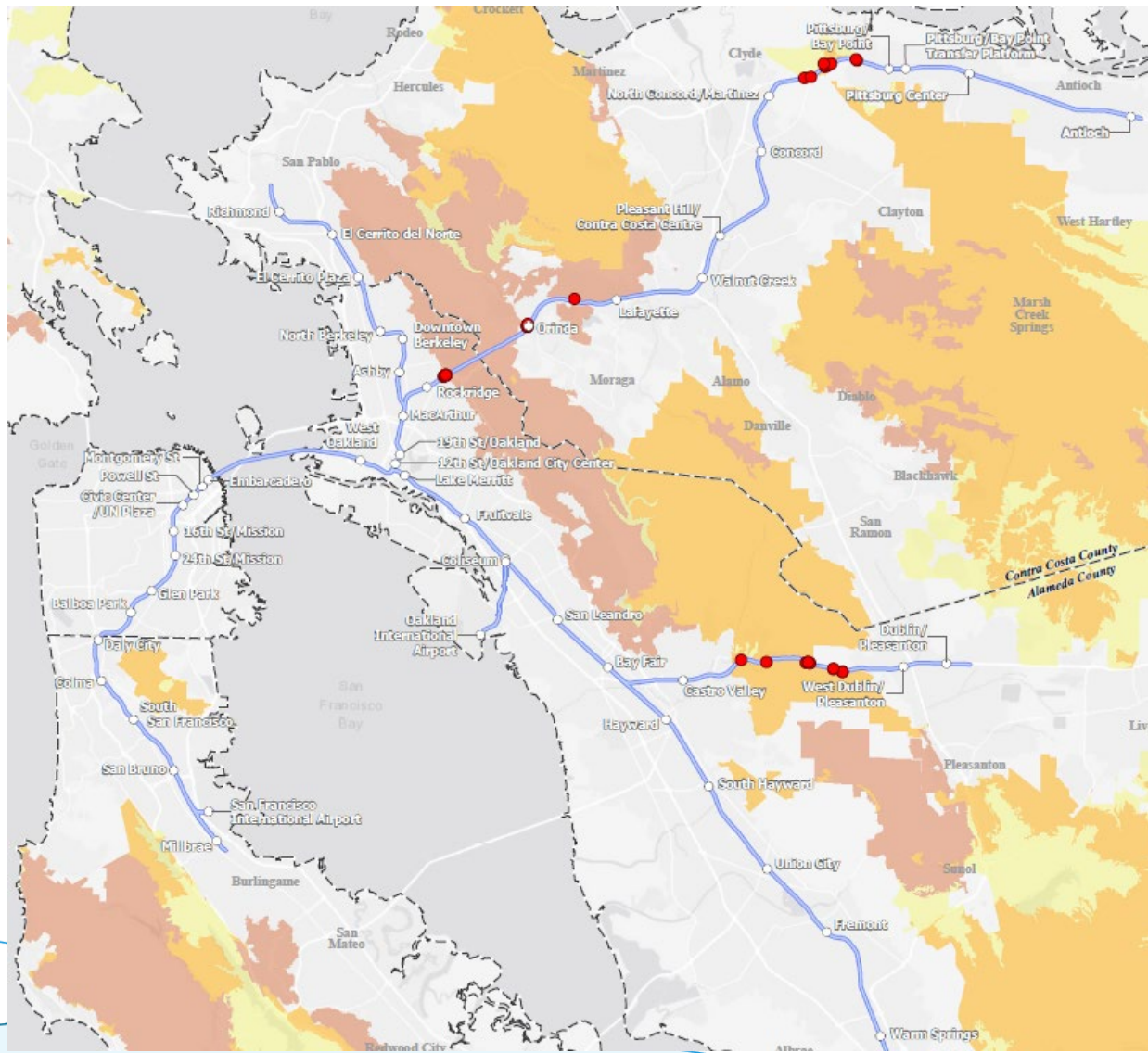

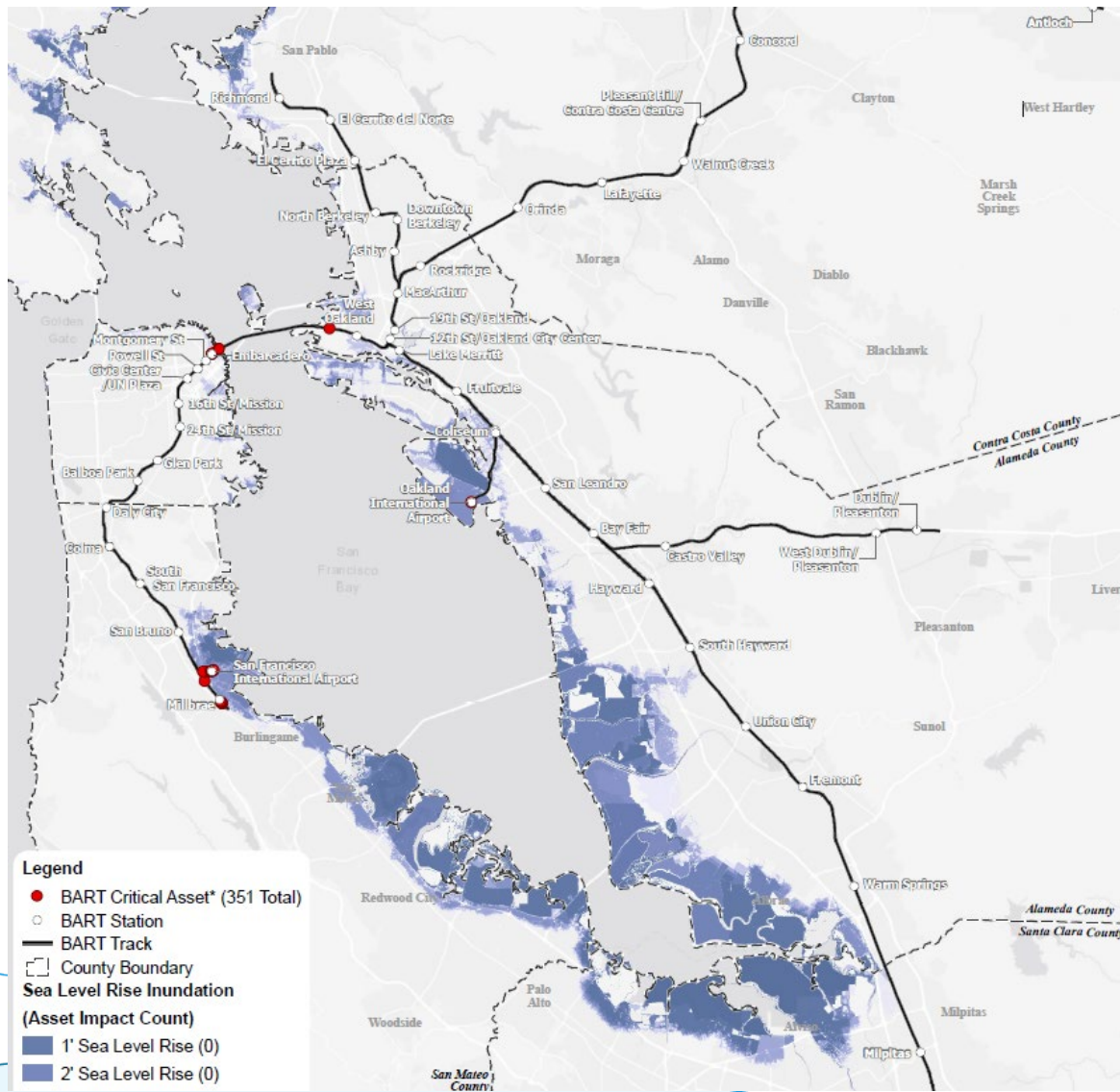
Existing Landslide Area (Asset Count)

High-Priority Mitigations

- Power resilience
- Fire suppression and alarm systems
- Inspect and improve facility structural integrity and safety
- Evacuation systems and communication
- Earthquake safety
- Network systems redundancy

Medium-Priority Mitigations

- Disaster recovery planning
- Earthquake detection and recovery improvements
- Enhance fire safety
- Flood safe facilities (water intrusion)
- Fire hazard removal
- Elevate/protect critical facilities
- Address homeless needs

Low-Priority Mitigation

- Irrigation and landscape improvements
